➔Section 1. KRS 214.468 is amended to read as follows: (1) any person seventeen (17) years of age or older may donate blood in a voluntary blood program, which is not operated for profit, without consent of the person's parent or legally-authorized representative. (2) **Any person sixteen (16) years of age may donate blood in a voluntary blood program, which is not operated for profit, with the written consent of the person's parent or legally authorized representative.** (3)The parent or legally-authorized representative **of a person who donates blood pursuant to subsection (1) or (2) of this section** shall not be held financially responsible for any medical complications arising from the blood donation. (4) Before soliciting blood donations from students in high schools, joint vocational schools, or technical schools, a blood program, in cooperation with school authorities, shall make reasonable efforts to notify the parents or legally-authorized representatives of the students that the students will be requested to donate blood.
